SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS, in Decision No. 9397 in the above entitled matter this Commission provided with reference to rates therein established that such rates would be subject to increase or decrease upon the approval of the Commission, on the basis of 3 cents per 1000 cubic feet for each 10 cent increase or decrease respectively, in the cost of oil above or below the price of \$1.50 per barrel at Monterey and \$1.87 per barrel at Salinas, and

WHEREAS, Coast Valleys Gas & Electric Company has heretofore filed with this Commission a statement that the price paid for oil had been reduced by 25 cents per barrel at both Monterey and Salinas, and the Commission has, in consequence, in Decision No. 10778 ordered reductions of 7 cents per 1000 cubic feet in the rates established in Decision No. 9397, and

WHEREAS, Coast Valleys Gas & Electric Company now has filed further statement that effective August 8, 1922, the price of oil has been further reduced by 25 cents per barrel, this being a total decrease of 50 cents per barrel from the base price on which rates were established in Decision No. 9397.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the rates set forth in Decision No. 9397, in Case No. 1611, designated as Schedules

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A and B, be and they are hereby reduced by 15 cents per 1000 cubic feet effective for all regular meter readings taken on and after September 8, 1922, this being a further reduction of 8 cents per 1000 cubic feet.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Coast Valleys Gas & Electric Company file with the Commission or or before September 9, 1922, a revision of its schedules to comply with this erder.
