Pacific Electric Railway Company, a corporation, has applied to the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the abandonment and removal of a certain spur track, approximately 505 feet in length, said spur track connecting with the main line track operated between San Bernardino and Highland at a point on Rathbun Street west of Sterling Avenue, as more fully shown on a blue print map marked C.E.H. 5674 attached to and forming a part of the application.

The spur track, herein proposed to be abandoned was originally constructed to serve the Holly Sugar Company and applicant alleges that other arrangements have been made to serve such patron; that the spur is no longer necessary for its business or for that of its patrons.

An inspection and investigation having been made, the Commission being now fully advised and of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary, and that

the application should be granted,
