FIFTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

The Railroad Commission, by Decision No. 11107, dated October 14, 1922, in the above entitled matter, authorized SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY to sell \$5,160,000.00 of its general and refunding mortgage bonds, subject to the condition, among others, that the proceeds, other than accrued interest, be deposited with a bank or banks, or a trust company or trust companies, and expended only for such purposes as the Commission might authorize.

The company, on November 24, 1922, filed a supplemental petition in this proceeding in which it reports that during the month of October it expended for construction purposes the sum of \$1,366,144.49, which has not been financed through the issue of stock or bonds. It requests permission to use \$1,366,144.49 of the proceeds obtained from the sale of the \$5,160,000 of bonds to reimburse itself on account of these reported construction expenditures which are shown in some detail in its "Exhibit No. 7".


The Commission has given consideration to applicant's request and believes that it should be granted, as herein provided, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY be, and it is hereby, authorized to use \$1,366,144.49 of the proceeds obtained from the sale of the \$5,160,000.00 of bonds, the

sale of which is authorized by Decision No. 11107, dated October 14, 1922, to finance its construction expenditures reported in its Exhibit No. 7, filed in the above entitled matter on November 24, 1922.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that the order in Decision No. 11107, dated October 14, 1922, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this Fifth Supplemental Order.
