In this application, as amended at the hearing held on November 28th before Examiner Williams, LOS ANGELES HARBOR WAREHOUSE COMPANY asks permission to discontinue its warehouse business.

It is of record that applicant owns a cement fire proof warehouse building and a brick building of semi-fireproof construction. Since the construction of these warehouse buildings, applicant has leased all of the floor space in such buildings to the Huntington Beach Warehouse Company; to the Santa Ana Wholesale Grocery Company; and to the Wilmington Transfer and Storage Company. For more than a year past applicant has not been operating any of its warehouse properties. They have been and are now operated by its lessees.

Due notice of the hearing on this application was given. No one appeared to protest against the granting of the application.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Los Angeles Harbor Warehouse Company be, and it is hereby, authorized to cancel its rates on

file with this Commission and after such cancellation in accordance with rule ten of General Order Number 61, and discontinue its warehouse business.
