SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Under Decision No. 9628, dated October 21, 1921, in the above entitled proceeding Henry Mangold was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers between Saugus and Los Angeles via Newhall, Sylmar, San Fernando, Pacoima and Burbank.

Condition No. 2 of the Order in said decision specifically provided that the service could not be discontinued unless authorized by the Railroad Commission. Investigation by the Service Department of the Railroad Commission shows that applicant herein stopped operation over two months ago, giving as his reason that other stage service was sufficient to adequately care for passenger traffic over the route which he was authorized to serve, further, that communications addressed to Henry Mangold have not been replied to nor could he be located either in person or through his attorney.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 9628 in the

above entitled proceeding be, and the same hereby is revoked
and annulled.
