ORDER DENYING REHEARING AND
REQUEST FOR MODIFICATION OF ORDER .

Applicant herein, having under date December 28, 1922 filed herein a petition for a rehearing of the above entitled matter for the purpose of amending the order herein, as contained in Decision No. 11291, decided November 29, 1922, whereby applicant would be permitted to transport the class of commodities heretofore authorized in less than truck load lots from Los Angeles to San Francisco, and from San Francisco to Los Angeles, and for a further amendment to the above mentioned order eliminating therefrom the restriction that applicant may not transport commodities from Los Angeles to Santa Barbara, and from Santa Barbara to Los Angeles, and the Commission having carefully considered the petition for rehearing and modification of its previous order, and finding nothing therein justifying the granting of said petition,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application for rehearing and modification of the order as contained in Decision No. 11291,

as decided November 29, 1922, be and the same hereby is denied.
