

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
Decision No. 114

In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company for an order authorizing the construction of spur tracks at grade across Sixth Street, City of Redlands, San Bernardino County, California.

Application No. 119.

O R D E R

By the Commission.

Southern Pacific Company having heretofore filed on June 25th, 1912, its application to construct at grade its spur tracks as hereinafter indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is a case in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid a grade crossing at the proposed points of crossing; and it further appearing that the applicant has secured the necessary franchise or permit from the City of Redlands, and that said application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to construct its two spur tracks at grade, in the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardino, California, and described as follows:

"NEW TRACK: Beginning at a point in the center line of the Southern Pacific Company's present spur track in Redlands Avenue, said point being at the present westerly terminus of aforesaid track and distant easterly 10 feet, more or less, from the prolongation across Redlands Avenue to the easterly line of Sixth Street; thence westerly along Redlands Avenue and across the intersection of Sixth Street 60 feet, more or less, to a point near the northwest corner of Redlands Avenue and Sixth St; thence westerly 170 feet, more or less, across private property."

"TRACK REARRANGED: Beginning at a point in the center line of the Southern Pacific Company's present spur track in Redlands Avenue, said point being distant northerly 18 feet, more or less, at right angles from the center line of the Southern Pacific Company's main track in Redlands Avenue and distant 20 feet, more or less, easterly measured parallel with aforesaid center line from its intersection with the prolongation of the easterly line of Sixth Street across Redlands Avenue; Thence westerly along an irregular curve a distance of 180 feet, more or less, to a connection with the present spur track of the Southern Pacific Company at a point distant northerly 31 feet, more or less, at right angles from the center line of the Southern Pacific Company's present main line track in Redlands Ave."

Subject to the following conditions, viz.:

- (1) The entire expense to complete said crossing shall be borne by the said railroad company.
- (2) The railroad company shall hereafter forever maintain said crossing in good and first-class condition for the use of the public.
- (3) The grades of approach to said crossing shall not exceed 8 percent and the width of roadbed at crown shall not be less than 24 feet.
- (4) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demands such action.
