ORDER REVOKING PREVIOUS ORDERS

At the public hearing of the above entitled application  
for modification of previous orders herein it appearing that  
*from the* ~~the~~ crossing heretofore authorized herein has not yet been con-  
structed and that the county has under consideration construction  
*from* of a highway parallelling the ~~highway~~ *railway* to Tracy which would make  
the authorized crossing unnecessary, and Southern Pacific Company  
being ready to grant to the county a license and easement over a  
portion of its right of way which would permit a crossing at right  
angles over the present crossing in the vicinity of said ~~the~~ *from*  
crossing as described in the railway company's above application,  
upon stipulation of the county and the railway company, and good  
cause appearing.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that the Order herein contained in  
Decision No. 4092 of February 8, 1917, and the Supplemental Order

herein contained in Decision No. 10638 of June 29, 1922,  
be and they each are, respectively, hereby revoked and set  
aside, and Application No. 2713 dismissed, without prejudice  
to the right of the County to file a new application for  
permission to construct said ~~Harbo~~ crossing.
