ORDER OF DISMISSAL.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company having on December 11, 1917, filed with the Railroad Commission an application for authority to increase its rates and charges for electric energy sold for agricultural and reclamation purposes, and the Railroad Commission having on December 30, 1922, by Decision 11457, established just and reasonable rates to be charged and collected for electric energy sold for such purposes as well as for other purposes.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application numbered 3381 of Pacific Gas and Electric Company be and the same is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
