### ORDER

WHEREAS, Section 29 of the Public Utilities Act provides that every public utility shall annually furnish to the Commission at such time and in such form as the Commission may require, a report in which the utility shall specifically answer all questions propounded by the Commission upon or concerning which the Commission may desire information; and

WHEREAS, this Commission has furnished the Bay Point and Clayton Railroad Company with a complete form for an annual report, which said form contains questions propounded by the Commission, and said Bay Point and Clayton Railroad Company has been repeatedly requested to answer said questions and to fill out said form and to return and file with this Commission said annual report, and said railroad company has failed and refused to comply with such requests, and has failed and refused to file with this Commission any annual report,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Railroad Commission of the State of California that Bay Point and Clayton Railroad Company, and S. H. Cowell, President, and W. H. George, Secretary, Treasurer and General Manager, on

behalf of said company, on or before February 2, 1914, file in the office of the Railroad Commission of the State of California an annual report in the form heretofore presented by said Commission to said company and in which said report said company and said S. E. Cowell, President, and said W. E. George, Secretary, Treasurer and General Manager, shall answer all of the questions propounded in said form.
