

In the matter of the application of
Sacramento and Woodland Railroad
Company, a corporation, for an order
authorizing the construction of a
spur track at grade across Main
street in the City of Woodland,
Yolo county, California.

ORDER

By the Commission.

Sacramento and Woodland Railroad Company
having heretofore filed with this Commission its application for
permission to construct a spur track at grade across Main street,
City of Woodland, Yolo county, California, and it appearing to the
Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is
necessary and that said company has obtained the necessary franchise
or permit from the City of Woodland to construct said spur track,
and that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid a grade
crossing at the proposed point of crossing and that said applica-
tion should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter
specified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted to
Sacramento and Woodland Railroad Company to construct a spur track
at grade across Main street in the City of Woodland, Yolo county,
California, on the east side of the Southern Pacific Railroad and
at a point about three hundred (300) feet east of said railroad,
said spur to be extended on the south side of Main street onto
land owned by the Diamond Match Company; said crossing to be made
subject to the following conditions, viz.:

(1) The entire expense of constructing said crossing and
its maintenance hereafter in good and first-class condition for
the safe and convenient use of the public shall be borne by the
Sacramento and Woodland Railroad Company.

(2) Said crossing shall have a width of not less than fifty

(50) feet. Said company shall provide and install the necessary crossing plank or guard rails for said crossing and ballast same with gravel or broken stone in a first-class manner for the safe and easy passage of vehicles and other road traffic.

(6) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
