ORDER

By the Commission,

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, Contra Costa County, having on April 22, 1914, filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct a public highway at grade across the track of Southern Pacific Railroad Company, near Concord, Contra Costa County, California, as hereinafter indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary, that applicant has secured an easement dated February 5, 1913, from Southern Pacific Railroad Company, granting permission to make said crossing at grade; and it further appearing that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid a grade crossing with said track, and that the application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HERREY ORDERED, That permission be hereby granted Board of Supervisors, Contra Costa County, California, to construct a public highway at grade across the track of Southern Pacific Railroad Company, near the Town of Concord, Contra Costa County, California, at Southern Pacific Railroad Company's Engineer's Station 301 plus 70, as shown by the map attached to the application and subject to the following conditions, viz.:-

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(1) The entire expense of constructing the crossing at grade shall be borne by applicant.

(2) The expense of maintaining the crossing thereafter in good and first-class condition for the safe and convenient use of the public shall be borne by applicant up to within two (2) feet on each side of the rails of Southern Pacific Railroad Company.

(3) Southern Pacific Railroad Company shall maintain said crossing across its track and to within two (2) feet of the outside thereof.

(4) Said crossing shall be constructed of a width not less than twenty-four (24) feet, with grades of approach not exceeding six (5) per cent, and shall be ballasted with first-class stone or gravel ballest to a depth of not less than six (6) inches, and in every way made safe and convenient for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.

(5) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public converience and necessity demand such action.
