O R D E R

By the Commission.

SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, a corporation, having on June 11, 1914, filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct its spur track at grade and to relocate its passing track and drill track across Second Street, in the City of Calexico, Imperial County, California, as hereinafter indicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary, that applicant has secured the necessary franchise or permit from the Board of Trustees of Calexico; and it further appearing that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid grade crossings with said Second Street, and that the application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That permission be hereby granted Southern Pacific Company to construct its spur track at grade and to relocate its passing track and drill track at grade across Second Street, in the City of Calexico, Imperial County, California, on the east side of its main line track, as shown by the map attached to the application, and subject to the following conditions, viz.:-

(1) Said spur track and said relocation of passing track and drill track to be constructed subject to the conditions of a certain Ordinance dated May 19, 1914, granting permission to Southern

Pacific Company to make said crossings at grade.

(2) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossings as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
