ORDER.

WHEREAS, it appears from the petition on file herein that Marin Water and Power Company has been charging the Department of Commerce and Labor 30 cents per thousand gallons for water furnished to said Department of Commerce and Labor and that petitioner alleges that said charge of 30 cents per thousand gallons does not provide for the maintenance of a certain wharf constructed by Marin Water and Power Company in connection with its service to said Department of Commerce and Labor and that the parties have agreed upon an increase in said rates from 30 cents to 40 cents per thousand gallons, whereof 30 cents is to be paid for the water and 10 cents for the establishment of a fund for wharf maintenance,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, as the parties have agreed to this increase in the rate, the establishment of the proposed rate be and the same is hereby authorized on condition that this authorization shall not be taken to establish the rate herein authorized as being necessarily a fair and reasonable rate.
