O P I N I O N .

This proceeding is essentially pro forma, and only the requirement under the law of holding the hearing makes it necessary that the hearing be held, because from the face of the application it can be determined that the application should be granted.

The applicant now owes Wells Fargo & Company's bank \$7,000, drawing interest at 6%, which was due August 8th. It wishes to pay \$1,000 and issue a new note for \$6,000 for ninety days at 6%. Thereafter the plan is to pay off \$1,000 each ninety days. It is only the necessity of issuing the new note that makes the permission of this Commission necessary.

I recommend that the application be granted and submit the following order:

O R D E R .

HANFORD GAS AND POWER COMPANY having applied to this Commission for permission to issue its note for six thousand (\$6,000) dollars for ninety (90) days, to draw interest at six per cent, which refunds a previously outstanding lawfully incurred indebtedness, and a hearing

having been held, and being fully apprised in the premises,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be granted to the Hanford Gas and Power Company to issue its said note for six thousand (\$6,000) dollars to Wells Fargo and Company's bank for ninety (90) days at six per cent; and that thereafter it be authorized to re-issue said note in the same or smaller amount at the same per cent up to and including the 10th day of August, 1915.

The foregoing opinion and order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the opinion and order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
