In the matter of the application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, a corporation, for permission to construct certain tracks at grade across a public highway in the town of Tracy, San Joaquin county, California.

O R D E R

By the Commission.

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, having on August 8, 1912, filed with the Commission its application for permission to construct at grade certain tracks across a public highway - the county road, in the town of Tracy, San Joaquin county, California, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary and that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid grade crossings at the proposed points of crossing; and it further appearing that said application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted to Southern Pacific Company to construct three (3) tracks at grade across the county road in the town of Tracy, San Joaquin county, California, two (2) of said tracks being parallel with and on the south side of two (2) tracks which now exist connecting the main line of said company between Tracy and Stockton with the branch line between Tracy and Kerman; the third (3rd) track to be constructed across the county road about one hundred eighty (180) feet south of the two crossings first mentioned and about fifty (50) feet south of the side-track now existing connecting Kerman with the south side of the yards of the said company at Tracy; all of said three (3) crossings above to be constructed in accordance with map filed with the application and subject to the following conditions, viz.:

- (1) The entire expense of constructing said crossings and the expense of their maintenance hereafter in good and first-class condition shall be borne by Southern Pacific Company.

(2) The crossings shall be ballasted with first-class broken stone or gravel ballast and provided with the necessary crossing plank or guard rails and otherwise constructed for the safe and easy passage of vehicles.

(3) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossings as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
