BY THE COMMISSION:

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the order of this Commission made in these proceedings on August 27, 1914, establishing the rates to be charged for water supplied by Eastside Canal and Irrigation Company be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

The rates established in these proceedings shall be payable on or before February first, for use during the ensuing season, and in every case in which payment is not made on or before February 14th a penalty of 25 cents per acre shall be added to said rates, and the failure of any consumer to pay the delinquent rate plus the penalty herein prescribed on or before April 14th of the same year shall forfeit the right of such consumer to demand water from said Company, provided the right of any consumer to demand water shall not be forfeited

unless said Company shall have given to the owner or consumer or person in possession and control of the land, two notices in writing,--the first of such notices to be delivered prior to February first, and the second of such notices to be delivered at least thirty days prior to April 14th, each of said notices to contain a statement of the rates fixed by this Commission for the supply of water by said Company and the regulation relating to the penalty of 25 cents per acre and the regulation relating to the forfeiture of the right to demand water as prescribed in this order.

This order entirely supersedes Rule 16 of the Rules and Regulations heretofore established by order of this Commission on March 31, 1914, providing that:

"The failure of any consumer to pay the water rate in advance as herein provided shall exonerate the company from any delivery of water to him during the year of the failure to so pay the rate."
