The Southern Sierras Power Company and F. A. Worthley having filed with this Commission their application for an order authorizing the assignment and transfer by the said F. A. Worthley to said The Southern Sierras Power Company of a certain franchise and franchise rights heretofore, and on the 26th day of March, 1912, granted by the City of Corona to said F. A. Worthley by Ordinance No. 241 of the board of trustees of said City to erect, construct, operate and maintain an electrical system consisting of poles, towers, wires, conduits and other necessary and convenient apparatus for transmitting and delivering electric energy for light, heat, power and other purposes within said City of Corona, and the board of trustees of Corona having informed this Commission by letter that they do not desire any hearing in this matter, and it appearing to the Commission that this is a case in which a public hearing is not necessary,

That said application be and the same is hereby granted.
