ORDER OF DISMISSAL

BY THE COMMISSION:

On June 29, 1914, the Commission made an order instituting an investigation on its own motion into the reasonableness of switching charges for handling intra-state carload freight to or from industry tracks or private sidings when incidental to line haul.

Since instituting this investigation, several of the larger lines have conferred with representatives of the Commission with the result that the Southern Pacific Company, The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company, Western Pacific Railway Company and San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad Company have agreed to file tariffs with the Commission cancelling switching charges in practically all cases.

The object of the Commission's investigation having thus been accomplished informally there exists now no reason for trying this case and an order of dismissal will be entered.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled case be and the same is hereby dismissed.
