O R D E R

By the Commission,

MINKLER SOUTHERN RAILWAY COMPANY, a corporation,  
having on November 30, 1914, filed with the Commission an application  
for permission to construct its main line track at grade across twelve  
streets or public highways, in the County of Tulare, and five streets  
in the City of Lindsay, Tulare County, California, as hereinafter in-  
dicated, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case  
in which a public hearing is necessary; that those crossings not  
within the city limits of Lindsay are not in incorporated territory,  
hence no franchise or permit for their construction at grade is necess-  
ary, and that applicant has secured the necessary franchise or permit  
for those crossings within the City of Lindsay, from the Board of  
Trustees of the City of Lindsay, granting permission to make said  
crossings at grade, and it further appearing that it is not reasonable  
nor practicable to avoid grade crossings with said streets and public  
highways, and that the application should be granted subject to the  
conditions hereinafter specified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That permission be hereby granted Minkler  
Southern Railway Company to construct its main line track at grade  
across the following streets and public highways in the County of  
Tulare, and City of Lindsay, Tulare County, California:-

Crossing No. 1- Public highway at engineer's station 1139 plus 46.5

Crossing No. 2- Public highway at engineer's station 1174 plus 82.4

Crossing No. 3- Public highway at engineer's station 1176 plus 42

Crossing No. 4- Public highway at engineer's station 1212 plus 11.2

Crossing No. 5- Public highway at engineer's station 1249 plus 64.9  
Crossing No. 6- Public highway at engineer's station 1251 plus 14.7  
Crossing No. 7- Public highway at engineer's station 1287 plus 91.3  
Crossing No. 8- Public highway at engineer's station 1324 plus 30  
Crossing No. 9- Public highway at engineer's station 1337 plus 53  
Crossing No. 10- Public highway at engineer's station 1351 plus 18.3  
Crossing No. 11- Public highway at engineer's station 1370 plus 97.7  
Crossing No. 12- Public highway at engineer's station 1384 plus 26.5  
Crossing No. 13- Public street in the City of Lindsay, known as Eu-  
calyptus Avenue, at engineer's station 1422 plus 02  
Crossing No. 14- Public street in the City of Lindsay, known as  
Hermosa Street, at about engineer's station 1434  
plus 90.  
Crossing No. 15- Public street in the City of Lindsay, known as  
Honolulu Street, at about engineer's station 1448  
plus 17.  
Crossing No. 16- Public street in the City of Lindsay, known as  
Valencia Street, at about engineer's station 1461  
plus 54.  
Crossing No. 17- Public street in the City of Lindsay, name unknown,  
at about engineer's station 1474 plus 81.1 -

All of the above as shown by the maps and profiles attached  
to the application and subject to the following conditions, viz.: -

- (1) The entire expense of constructing the crossings, together  
with the cost of their maintenance thereafter in good and first-class  
condition for the safe and convenient use of the public shall be borne  
by applicant.
- (2) Said crossings shall be constructed of a width and type of con-  
struction to conform to that portion of the streets to be crossed now  
graded, with grades of approach not exceeding six (6) per cent, and  
shall in every way be made safe and convenient for the passage  
thereover of vehicles and other road traffic.
- (3) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders  
relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and  
protection of said crossings as to it may seem right and proper, and  
to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience

and necessity demand such action.
