ORDER

T. G. Schmeiser, et al., freeholders of Yolo county, California, having on August 22, 1912, filed with this Commission an application for authority to vacate and abandon portions of certain public highways now crossing the property of Southern Pacific Railroad Company in the town of Davisville, Yolo county, California, as hereinafter indicated, and a public hearing having been held at Woodland on September 4, 1912, at which applicants and other parties interested were represented; and it appearing from the testimony taken at said hearing that it is reasonable and practicable and in the interest of the public that said application be granted;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted to applicants, to the Board of Supervisors of said Yolo county, and to Southern Pacific Railroad Company to vacate, abandon and close to public use the following public highways in the said town of Davisville, viz.:

- (1) All that portion of First street lying between a line drawn parallel to and one hundred and ten (110) feet north of the north line of Olive street and the south line of Plum street.
