FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

This Commission having issued its Order in the above entitled matter on April 1, 1915 (Decision No. 2271) and said Order having authorized Southern Counties Gas Company to use the proceeds from the sale of \$150,000.00 of its Three Year Six Per Cent Gold Notes for the purpose of paying notes and accounts payable as specified in said Order;

And the applicant now having asked this Commission to modify said Order to the end that it be authorized to use a part of the proceeds derived from the sale of said \$150,000.00 of its Three Year Six Per Cent Gold Notes for the purpose of acquiring \$20,000.00 par value of its First Mortgage Bonds for sinking fund purposes, and good cause appearing;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Order of this Commission of April 1, 1915 in the above entitled matter (Decision No. 2271) be and it is hereby amended to the end that Southern Counties Gas Company be given authority and it is hereby given authority to use a portion of the proceeds derived from the sale of \$150,000.00 of its Three Year 6% Gold Notes for the purpose of acquiring \$20,000.00 par value of its First Mortgage Bonds on the condition that said bonds shall be placed in a sinking fund provided under applicant's First Mortgage and Deed of Trust;

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Order of this Commission of April 1, 1915 in the above entitled matter (Decision No. 2271) remain in full ^{and} ~~course~~ and effect so far as not in conflict with the Order herein.

The foregoing First Supplemental Order is hereby approved and ordered filed as the First Supplemental Order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
