SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

WHEREAS, this Commission by Decision No. 2726, ³ _{HEW}
dated August 31, 1915, authorized the delivery to WESTERN
STATES GAS AND ELECTRIC COMPANY of \$182,000 face value of bonds,
the issuance of which was authorized by decision No. 2550,
dated June 30, 1915, provided said Western States Gas and
Electric Company deposit with the trustee, Girard Trust
Company, the sum of \$182,000 in cash, said \$182,000 so de-
posited with the trustee to be withdrawn by applicant herein
from time to time, in accordance with order of this Commis-
sion permitting the withdrawal, and

WHEREAS, applicant on November 17, 1915, filed a
statement showing that it has expended from October 1, 1915
to October 31, 1915, both dates inclusive, the sum of
\$24,341.16 for extensions, additions and betterments, and

WHEREAS, applicant asks for authority to withdraw
from the aforesaid fund of \$182,000 on deposit with the
trustee the sum of \$24,341.16, and

GOOD CAUSE APPEARING.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Western States Gas and

Electric Company be given, and it is hereby given, authority to withdraw from Girard Trust Company, trustee, the sum of \$24,341.16, said \$24,341.16 being a portion of the fund deposited with the trustee in accordance with Decision No. 2726, dated August 31, 1915, of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Decision No. 2550, dated June 30, 1915, as amended by Decisions No. 2697, No. 2726 and No. 2657 remain in full force and effect except as they may be in conflict with this Sixth Supplemental Order.
