<u>O P I N I O N</u>

By consent of all parties, given at the public hearing held herein in San Francisco on April 24, 1916, the above entitled proceedings were consolidated for hearing and decision.

•In Application No. 2173, California Natural Gas Company asks authority to sell its entire property, used in the natural gas business in Kern County, to Valley Natural Gas Company for \$490,000.00 in cash and \$100,000.00 par value of common stock of Valley Natural Gas Company.

In Application No. 2172, as amended. Valley Natural Gas Company asks authority to execute a mortgage or deed of trust securing the payment of \$2,000,000.00 face value of 6% serial first mortgage bonds; to issue \$378,000.00 face value of said bonds; to issue \$200,000.00 par value of preferred stock; to issue \$100,000.00 par value of common stock and to issue its promissory note for \$247,500.00 to the Anglo-California Trust Company of San Francisco for \$247,500.00 to be borrowed from said Trust Company.

Valley Natural Gas Company desires to issue at this time, \$100,000.00 face value. of bonds numbered 1 to 100, inclusive, to be sold at not less than 92½% of face value plus accrued interest and \$278,000.00 face value of bonds, numbered 101 to 378, both inclusive, to secure in part the promissory note for \$347,500.00 to be issued to Anglo-California Trust Company. Valley Natural Gas Company asks authority to sell, at not less than 90% of their face value plus accrued interest bonds of the face value of \$250,000.00, being bonds numbered 101 to 550, both inclusive, being a portion of said bonds of the face value of \$278,000.00, and to use the proceeds obtained from such sale to pay in part the aforementioned loan from the Anglo-California Trust Company.

Of the preferred stock which Valley Natural Gas Company proposes to issue \$5,500.00 par value is to be issued to C. B. Colby at \$90.91 per share to reimburse said C. B. Colby for \$5,000.00 paid by him to California Natural Gas Company as part payment for said company's property: \$161,200.00 par value of preferred stock is to be sold at not less than \$90.00 per share to pay in part the purchase price of the properties to be acquired from California Natural Gas Company: and \$33,300.00 par value of

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preferred stock is to be sold at not less than \$90.00 per share to pay in part the aforementioned loan from Anglo-California Trust Company.

The \$100,000.00 par value of common stock is to be issued to California Natural Gas Company as part payment Of the purchase price of the property to be acquired by Valley Natural Gas Company from California Natural Gas Company. C. B. Colby testified that he has agreed, verbally, to purchase from California Natural Gas Company said \$100,000.00 par value of common capital stock at \$80.00 per share. Said \$100,000.00 par value of common stock is to be pledged by California Natural Gas Company as part security for the \$247,500.00 loan. In the event that C. B. Colby acquires this stock, he is to permit it to remain in pledge until the loan has been repaid. It is the intention of the Valley Natural Gas Company to pay the \$247,500.00 note within one year after date through the issue of preferred stock and bonds as hereinbefore indicated. Assuming that the loan will be repaid within a year, Valley Natural Gas Company, according to those applications, will have issued for property of California Natural Gas Company \$100,000.00 par value of common stock, approximately \$200,000.00 par value of 8% preferred stock and \$350,000.00 face value of 6% bonds. Reference will hereinafter be made to the value of the property which Walley Natural Gas Company proposes to acquire and to its carning power.

California Natural Gas Company was incorporated in 1910 for the purpose of distributing and selling natural

gas produced by the Standard Oil Company in the Midway oil field and vicinity. The company sells gas at wholesale to the Bakersfield Gas and Electric Company, controlled by San Joaquin Light and Power Corporation, for distribution in Bakersfield, to the West Side Gas Company for distribution in Taft and Maricopa and to Joseph McDonald for distribution in Fellows. Less than 20% of the operating revenues of California Natural Gas Company, however, are obtained from the sale of gas to other public utilities. More than 80% of the earnings of the company are obtained from the sale of natural gas to oil operators.

Exclusive of depreciation, the net operating revenues of California Natural Gas Company, as shown by Table No. I, have been as follows:

Inesmuch as the company has no bonded indebtedness, practically all of the not operating revenues have been available for depreciation charges or dividends.

Valley Natural Gas Company contends that the earnings for 1915 are not a fair criterion of the earning power of the California Natural Gas Company properties. The company reports that during the latter part of 1915, considerable extensions were made and that the earnings from these extensions are reflected in the earning statement only in the months of November and December, 1915. In applicants' Exhibit No. 1, the gross earnings for the 5 months ending March 51, 1916, are reported to have been \$94,670.09. The operating expenses, including taxes but not depreciation, are reported at \$66,118.50, leaving a net operating revenue of \$28,551.50. On the basis of the showing made for 3 months, Valley Natural Gas Company estimates that the net earnings for 1916 will be in excess of \$98,000.00.

In applicants' Exhibit No. 7, it is alleged that an additional supply of gas is soon to be obtained for service in the present field of operation and that a demand now exists in the present territory for additional gas in the amount of 20% of the gas at present dolivered to California Natural Cas Company. In view of this possible increase in operating revenues. Valley Natural Gas Company contends that it is fair to assume

that the company during the next 10 years will realize a net operating revenue of \$98,000.00 per annum. If these expectations should be realized, the company contends that it would be able to pay off \$350,000.00 face value of bonds, redeem \$200,000.00 par value of preferred stock, pay interest on its bonds and 8% dividends upon its preferred and common stock and accumulate a cash surplus of \$93,000.00.

There is no evidence to show that the proposed contract (Applicants' Exhibit No. 5) between California Natural Gas Company and Standard Oil Company was taken into consideration in arriving at the assumed annual net revenue of \$98,000.00. Should these applications be granted, this contract is to be assigned by California Natural Gas Company to Valley Natural Gas Company.

Article III of the contract reads:

"In its operations and in the conduct of its business, the Oil Company utilizes gas in large quantities, and there is excepted from this contract, and reserved from the sale of gas herein provided for, the gas produced and saved by the Oil Company and required by the Oil Company in its operations and the conduct of its business up to, but not exceeding, six million cubic feet of gas per day."

When demanded by the Gas Company, the Oil Company agrees to erect one compressor plant on the Oil Company's land in Korn County, and to compress the gas taken from the Oil Company's wells, to a pressure not less than 250 pounds. The cost of the compressor plant shall be paid by the Oil Company. The cost of operating the compressor plant, exclusive of depreciation, interest and overhead charges, the cost of transmitting the gas from the wells to the compressor plant and the cost of installing the mains from the wells to the compressor plant shall be borne by the Gas Company. All gaseline or vapor content produced in the process of compression shall belong to the Oil Company.

During a period of five years from the date of the contract, the Gas Company shall pay to the Oil Company 5 cents per 1000 cubic feet of natural gas at a temperature of 60° Fahrenheit on a four ounce base over and above 14.4 pounds atmospheric pressure for all gas taken by the Gas Company from the Oil Company and resold by it at meter measurement. For gas sold by the Gas Company on a flat rate basis, it shall pay to the Oil Company five-sevenths of its gross receipts from such sales, provided that such payment shall not exceed 5 cents per 1000 cubic fact.

Mr. G. S. Jacobs, one of this Commission's assistant ongineors, testified that the original cost, the cost to reproduce new and the cost to reproduce new less depreciation of the physical structures of California Natural Gas Company as of March 1, 1916 was as follows:

Mr. Jacobs testified that the estimated reproduction cost new as of December 1, 1915 was \$591,562.75, being \$3,123.25 less than the estimate of the J. G. White Engineering Corporation. This difference is largely accounted for by the difference in allowance for overhead expenses.

The difference in the original cost, as reported by Mr. Jacobs and the cost to reproduce new as testified to both by Mr. Ryan and Mr. Jacobs is due in part to the fact that the original cost, as shown on the books of California Natural Gas Company included only a partial allowance for overhead expenditures and largely to the fact that certain drill and casing pipe. most of which had been used by Standard Oil Company for well casing and which was later, in September, 1915, sold by Standard Oil Company as second hand pipe to California Natural

Gas Company for \$40,000.00 was considered, in the engineers' estimates of cost to reproduce, as though it were new pipe. Mr. Jacobs estimated that the cost to reproduce this pipe new, adding freight, would be \$116,924.14.

In addition to acquiring the physical structures of California Natural Gas Company, the Valley Natural Gas Company will acquire the current assets and assume the current liabilities of California Natural Gas Company. On March 31, 1916, the current assets were reported to be \$66,357.05, and the current liabilities were reported to be \$46.657.93. The difference between the current assets and current liabilities amounts to \$19.699.12. In addition to the current liabilities assumed by Velley Natural Gas Company, the company will be obliged to pay 6% interest on \$485,000.00 from December 1, 1915 to the date of the transfer of the properties. The interest to and including March 31, 1916 on the \$485,000.00 amounts to \$9,700.00. leaving the net current assets as of March 31, 1916, amounting to \$9,999.12. The sum total of the net current assets plus reproduction cost less depreciation, as found by Mr. Jacobs, es of March 31, 1916, amounts to \$504,514.49.

Should these applications be granted. Valley Natural Gas Company during the first year of operation will be called upon to meet the following charges:

Those charges make no allowance for the rotirement of bonds, \$50,000.00 of which mature March 15, 1918, and \$50,000.00 annually thereafter.

Valley Natural Gas Company asks authority to execute to Anglo-California Trust Company a mortgage or deed of trust securing the payment of \$2,000,000.00 face value of first mortgage 6% serial gold bonds. The bonds are to be dated March 15. 1916. Of the bonds, \$700,000.00 face value, numbered 1 to 700 inclusive, are to mature serially, \$50,000.00 face value of said bonds maturing each year beginning March 15, 1918 to and including March 15, 1931. The remaining \$1,300,000.00 face value of bonds, being bonds numbered 701 to 2000 inclusive, mature March 15, 1946. The bonds bear interest at the rate of 6% per ennum, payable semi-annually March 15 and September 15 of each year. Bonds are callable at par plus accrued interest. To further secure the payment of bonds numbered 701 to 2000 inclusive, the company agrees to pay to the trustee on September 15. 1924 and annually thereafter to and including September 15. 1931, an amount equal to one-half of 1% of the said bonds, numbered 701 to 2000 inclusive, outstanding. On September 15, 1932, and annually thereafter until the maturity of the bonds. an amount equal to 1% of said bonds outstanding is to be paid to the trustee. Like amounts are to be set aside during the aforementioned years for an improvement fund. The deed of trust contains a provision that none of the bonds numbered 701 to 2000 inclusive shall be issued for the payment of cost of extensions, additions or betterments, unless such extensions, additions or betterments have a prospective life at least as long as March 15, 1946. The company may issue bonds subsequent to the issue of bonds numbered 1 to 350 inclusive to pay for 70% of the reasonable cost of extensions, additions, or betterments, provided the gross carnings of the company, after deducting operating expenses including taxes, insurance and

reasonable allowance for repairs and maintenance shall be equal to 2% times the interest on the bonds outstanding plus the interest on the bonds to be issued. It is the intention of the Valley Natural Cas Company to issue its serial bonds to pay for cost of extensions, additions and betterments to its natural gas transmission and distribution system. and to use the remaining \$1,300,000.00 face value of bonds, maturing in 1946, to pay for artificial gas plants or other investments which partake of a more permanent nature than the natural gas industry.

According to the terms of Exhibit "D" attached to Application No. 2175, Valley Natural Gas Company proposes to borrow from Anglo-California Trust Company \$250,000.00, the same to be used in part payment for the properties to be acquired from California Natural Gas Company.

The company originally proposed to dispose of its bonds at 90% of the face value thereof, plus accrued interest. It now appears that the company will be able to sell the same for not less than 92% of the face value and accrued interest, netting \$92,500.00 instead of \$90,000.00, as originally contemplated. It thus becomes necessary for the company to borrow \$247,500.00 instead of \$250,000.00. The indebtedness to the Anglo-California Trust Company is to be represented by a note payable within one year after date, said note to be cocured by pledging \$278,000.00 face value of bonds and \$100,000.00 par value of common stock. Inasmuch as the note is to be issued for a term of one year, this Commission's authorization is not necessary. The Commission's consent, however, must be obtained to the pledge of the bonds and the issue of the common stock.

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Valley Natural Gas Company states that it is its hope and intention to gather and conserve for sale natural gas which . is now going to waste, and to extend its field of operation into new sections of territory. It proposes to construct a line into the Kern River potroleum fields for the purpose of selling gas for the pumping of oil wells. It has made a preliminary survey of a portion of the San Joaquin Valley and states its belief that large opportunities are offered for the distribution and sale of natural gas over an extensive area reaching as for north as Fresno.

It is stated that the development of the company's plans will procoed in a measure commonsurate with its sbility to finance.

The original financial undertakings of the Valley Natural Gas Company are on a high interest basis. The company anticipates, however, with the development of its plans, to obtain more favorable terms than it can at the outset.

It has heretofore been pointed out with some particularity by this Commission that natural gas enterprises are hazardous in their very nature and that they may not therefore be judged by the ordinary standards applicable to public utility projects. I believe the applicant herein should be encouraged in its efforts to undertake the conservation of natural gas now going to waste, and to extend its realm of usefulness, provided that the substitution of this agency with its plan of financing, for California Natural Gas Company, does not result in an increase of rates to the customers of California Natural Gas Company.

I recommend that this application be granted, subject to the conditions specified in the order herein, and submit the following form of order:

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CALIFORNIA NATURAL GAS COMPANY having applied to the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the sale of its entire property used in the natural gas business in Kern County, California, to Valley Natural Gas Company and Valley Natural Gas Company having applied to the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing the issue of capital stock and bonds, as set forth in the opinion which procedes this order, and to execute a mortgage or deed of trust of its properties to Anglo-California Trust Company, of San Francisco, and a public hearing having been held and the Railroad Commission finding that the purposes for which Valley Natural Gas Company proposes to issue said capital stock and bonds are not in whole or in part reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. California Natural Gas Company is hereby authorized to sell to Valley Natural Gas Company the entire property of California Natural Gas Company used in the natural gas business in Kern County, California, which property is more particularly described in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and made a part horeof, on the following conditions and not otherwise, to-wit:

(a) If California Natural Gas Company proposes to transfer to Valley Natural Gas Company any franchise or permit from the Board of Supervisors of Kern County or other public authority, authorizing the use of any public road or highway in Kern County, the authority herein given to California Natural Gas Company to transfer its property to Valley

Natural Cas Company shall not become effective Until the Railroad Commission shall have issued a supplemental order herein reciting that Valley Natural Cas Company has filed

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herein a stipulation, duly authorized by its Board of Directors, declaring that Valley Natural Gas Company, its successors and assigns, will never claim in any proceeding before the Railroad Commission or any court or other public authority, any value for such franchise or permit in excess of the price being paid therefor by Valley Natural Gas Company, which price shall be specified in such stipulation.

(b) Within thirty days from the execution and delivery by California Natural Gas Company of a deed conveying its properties to Valley Natural Cas Company, California Natural Gas Company shall file horein a true and correct copy of such deed.

2. Valley Natural Gas Company is hereby authorized to issue \$373,000.00, face value, of its first mortgage 6 per cent serial gold bonds, being bonds numbered 1 to 378, inclusive, to be secured by the deed of trust or mortgage hereinafter referred to; 2000 shares of 8 per cent preferred stock of the par value of \$100.00 per share; and 1000 shares of common stock of the par value of \$100.00 per share; and to execute a mortgage or deed of trust of its properties to Anglo-California Trust Company, of San Francisco, trustee, substantially in the form of the deed of trust or mortgage filed herein in Application No. 2172, and marked Exhibit "B", to which document reference is hereby made, said deed of trust being dated March 15, 1916, and securing an authorized issue of two million dollars, face value, of first mortgage 6 per cent serial gold bondsell upon the conditions following and not otherwise, to-wit:

(a) Of the \$378,000.00 of bonds herein suthorized to be issued, \$100,000.00 of bonds, being bonds numbered 1 to 100, inclusive, shall be sold so as to net Valley Natural Gas Company not less than 92 1/2% of the face value thereof plus accrued interest thereon; \$250,000.00, face value, of said bonds, being bonds numbered 101 to 350, both numbers inclusive,

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may be sold by Valley Natural Gas Company so as to not not less than 90% of the face value thereof plus accrued interest thereon: and \$278,000.00. face value of said bonds, being bonds numbered 101 to 378, both numbers inclusive, may be pledged as collateral security for a promissory note in the sum of \$247,500.00, to be issued by Valley Natural Gas Company to Anglo-California Trust Company.

(b) Of the 2000 shares of 8% preferred stock herein cuthorized to be issued, 55 shares shall be issued to C. B. Coldy to reimburse said Colby for \$5000.00 paid by him to California Natural Gas Company as part payment for soid company's property and 1945 shares of said stock shall be sold so as to net Valley Natural Gas Company not less than \$90.00 per share.

(c) The 1000 shares of common stock herein authorized to be issued shall be issued to California Natural Gas Company in part payment for its property.

(d) The proceeds from the sale of \$100,000.00 of bonds, being bonds numbered 1 to 100, inclusive, and from 1612 shares of the 8% preferred stock of Valley Natural Gas Company, shall be applied toward the purchase of the properties of California Natural Gas Company.

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(e) The proceeds from the sale of \$250,000.00 of bonds herein authorized to be issued, being bonds numbered 101 to 350. inclusive, and the proceeds from the sale of 333 shares of 8% preferred stock of Valley Natural Gas Company herein authorized to be issued, shall be used for the purpose of paying off a promissory note in the sum of \$247,500.00 which Valley Natural Gas Company proposes to issue to Anglo-California Trust Company.

(f) The authority herein granted to issue stocks and bonds is conditioned upon the acquisition by Valley Natural

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Gas Company of the entire properties of California Natural Gas Company used in the natural gas business in Kern County for not to exceed \$490,000.00 in cash and 1000 shares of the common stock of Valley Natural Gas Company.

(g) The authority hereby given to Valley Natural Gas Company to issue capital stock and bonds shall not be offective until the Reilroad Commission shall have issued a supplemental order reciting that Valley Natural Gas Company has filed herein a stipulation, duly authorized by its Board of Directors, and in form satisfactory to the Railroad Commission, declaring that Valley Natural Gas Company, its successors and assigns, will never claim before the Railroad Commission or any court or other public authority, that the capital stock and bonds of Valley Natural Gas Company herein authorized represent for rate making or other purposes the fair value of the properties of California Natural Gas Company to be acquired by Valley Natural Gas Company.

(h) The authority hereby given to Valley Natural Gas Company to issue capital stock and bonds shall not become effective until the Railroad Commission shall have issued a supplemental order reciting that Valley Natural Gas Company has filed herein a stipulation, duly authorized by its Board of Directors, and in form satisfactory to the Railroad Commission, declaring that Valley Natural Gas Company, its successors and assigns, will never **alkim** ask for authority to increase the rates new being charged by California Natural Gas Company to its present consumers, by reason or as the result of the transfer of the proporties of California Natural Gas Company to Valley Natural Gas Company, and that if Valley Natural Gas Company ever asks authority to increase the rates new charged by California Natural Gas Company to its existing consumers or

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any of them, such application will be based solely on increased costs of construction, maintenance or operation in no way caused by or growing out of said transfer of the properties of California Natural Gas Company to Valley Natural Gas Company.

(i) The approval herein given to Valley Natural Gas Company to execute a deed of trust or mortgage of its properties is for the purpose of this proceeding only and an approval in so far as the Railroad Commission has jurisdiction under the terms of the Public Utilities Act, and is not intended as an approval of said deed of trust or mortgage as to such other legal requirements to which said deed of trust or mortgage may be subject.

(j) Valley Natural Gas Company shall keep separate, true and accurate accounts showing the receipt and application in detail of the proceeds of the sale of the capital stock and bonds hereby authorized to be issued and on or before the 25th day of each month the company shall make a verified report to the Railroad Commission stating the sale or sales of said stock and bonds during the preceding month. the terms and conditions of the sale, the moneys realized thereform and the use and application of such moneys. all in accordance with this Commission's General Order No. 24, which order, in so far as applicable, is made a part of this order.

(k) The authority herein granted to issue bonds is conditioned upon the payment of the fee prescribed by the Public Utilities Act.

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(1) The authority herein given to issue stock and bonds shall apply only to such stock and bonds as shall have been issued on or before May 31, 1917.

The foregoing opinion and order are hereby approved and ordered filed as the opinion and order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
