

Decision No. 342

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of the application of Vallejo and Northern Railroad Company, a corporation, for an order determining whether its branch and trunk line of railroad now completed between Boynton and Armijo and from a point upon its main line near the town of Fairfield to Fairfield Junction, all in Solano County, California, yields sufficient income to defray the expenses of maintenance and operation.

ORDER

By the Commission.

Vallejo and Northern Railroad Company, a corporation, having on November 15, 1912, filed with the Commission an application for an order determining whether that portion of its main line now completed between Boynton and Armijo and that portion of its branch line now completed from a point upon its main line near the town of Fairfield to Fairfield Junction, a total distance of 5.51 miles, all of which completed railroad lies in Solano County, California, yields sufficient income to operate the same.

After an examination it has been found and determined that the total operating expenses of said 5.51 miles of railroad from October 24 to November 18, 1912, were \$1,406.57, and the total earnings derived from operation during the said period was \$17.40; and it further appearing that said earnings are not sufficient to operate said railroad and that the application should be granted, and it appearing that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that after an examination of the account of earnings and operating expenses of the above described railroad of applicant, the Commission hereby finds that the operation of said railroad does not yield income sufficient to operate the same.
