ORDER

The Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County having, on June 5, 1916, granted to Port Costa Wharf Company a renewal of a wharf franchise theretofore granted on July 6, 1896, the renewal of said franchise being, in part, as follows:

"Resolved and ordered that the application of the said Port Costa Wharf Company, a corporation, for a renewal of the franchise granted by this Board to the Port Costa Wharf Company, a corporation, on July 6, 1896, who is now the owner and holder thereof, be, and the same is hereby granted, and that the said franchise be, and the same is, hereby renewed, and that the said Port Costa Wharf Company, a corporation be, and it is hereby granted, for the term of twenty years, from the 5th day of June, 1916, the right to erect, construct and maintain a wharf on the place mentioned in its petition and hereinafter described, and to take tolls for the use of the same at rates to be fixed by the Board of Super-visors of the County of Contra Costa, State of California, on all those certain overflowed and submerged lands belonging to the State of California, over which the tide ebbs and flows, bordering on the Straits of Carquinez, a navigable arm of the sea, situate in Township Number Two. Supervisor District Number Two, in Contra Costa County, State of California, and more particularly described as contained within the following boundaries, to-wit:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the franchise granted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Contra Costa, State of California, to the Port Costa Wharf Company on May 1, 1882; thence S. 4705° E.,

along the northeast boundary line of said wharf four hundred and three and 6/10 (403.6) feet to station; thence N. 42 55° E., to the pier head line as established by the Board of Engineers of the United States Army in 1888; thence following said pier head line in a northwesterly direction to a point which bears N. 42° 55° E., from the point of beginning; thence S. 42° 55° W. to the point of beginning, being in quantity 32,620 square feet.

Subject however, to the approval of the Railroad Commission of the State of California."

and Port Costa Wharf Company having filed this application for a certificate declaring that public convenience and necessity require the exercise of the rights granted by the renewal of said franchise, and that said renewal be approved, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Railroad Commission hereby approves the renewal of the wharf franchise above-mentioned, and declares that public convenience and necessity require the exercise by Port Costa Wharf Company of the rights granted to it by the Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County in the renewal of said wharf franchise, upon the following condition, and not otherwise, to wit:

This order shall not become effective until Port
Costa Wharf Company shall have filed with this Commission
a stipulation, duly authorized by the Board of Directors of
said corporation, stating that neither Port Costa Wharf Company, its successors or assigns, shall, at any time, claim before the Railroad Commission or any other body for rate fixing
or other purposes, a value for said wharf franchise granted to
said corporation by the Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa
County on July 6, 1896, or the renewal of said wharf franchise
granted to said corporation by the Board of Supervisors of said
county on June 5, 1916, in excess of the actual cost of procuring

the same, which cost, if any, shall be stated in the stipulation and the Commission shall have issued a supplemental order herein stating that said stipulation has been filed, and approving the same.
