O R D E R

By the Commission.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS of Placer County, California,
 and SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, a corporation, having on November 19,
 1912, filed with the Commission a joint application for permission to
 separate grades at a public highway crossing with the tracks of said
 company between Magra and Gold Run, Placer County, California; and it
 appearing to this Commission that this is not a case in which a public
 hearing is necessary, that applicants have agreed as to the character
 and mode of abolishing a grade crossing which now exists of a public
 highway with the tracks of said company and in lieu thereof to construct an
 undergrade crossing thereby eliminating said grade crossing, and it
 further appearing that the elimination of said grade crossing is very
 desirable and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that permission be hereby granted
 Board of Supervisors of Placer County, California, and Southern Pacific
 Company, to separate grades for a public highway now crossing the
 tracks of said company at a point between Magra and Gold Run, Placer
 County, California, in the southwest quarter of section eight (8),
 township fifteen (15) north, range ten (10) east, N.D.M. and at
 engineer's station 3633+93 of said company, as shown by the maps
 attached to the application, provided that the crossing shall hereafter
 be maintained by applicants in good and first-class condition for the
 safe and convenient use of the public and further provided that said

undergrade crossing shall be completed in accordance with the plans and specifications attached to the application.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
