FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

WHEREAS this Commission on June 29, 1916, Decision Number 3470, authorized the applicant herein to issue 20 promissory notes for \$250.00 each, said notes to bear interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum, to be payable serially 1 each six months and to be secured by a deed of trust upon all of applicant's property, upon the condition that said deed of trust should first be approved by the Commission in writing; and

WHEREAS applicant on July 10, 1916 filed with the Commission for its approval a copy of deed of trust to Hellman Commercial Trust and Savings Bank and Fred Hoffman securing an issue of 20 promissory notes of the face value of \$250.00 each, bearing interest at 7 per cent per annum, payable

serially 1 each 6 months and providing for 90 days written notice to applicant before beginning any proceeding to advertise or sell applicant's property;

And it appearing to this Commission that said deed of trust is in proper form and should be approved;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Willowbrook Water Company be and it is hereby authorized to execute a mortgage upon its properties substantially in the form of a deed of trust submitted by applicant on July 10, 1916 and marked Exhibit "E".

The approval herein given of said mortgage is for the purpose of this proceeding only and an approval in so far as this Commission has jurisdiction under the terms of the Public Utilities Act, and is not intended as an approval of said mortgage as to such other legal requirements to which said mortgage may be subject.
