O P I N I O N.

This is an application by Peter Mathieson for a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the furnishing by him of water to three of his neighbors in the town of Centerville, Alameda County.

A public hearing was held in Centerville, July 3, 1916. From the evidence it appears that applicant is the owner of a certain lot of land in Centerville situated about 300 yards from the center of said town, upon which is situated the well from which he obtains his water supply. He commenced serving certain of his neighbors approximately two and one-half years ago and has been serving them continuously since that time. Applicant is not operating under a franchise, as no part of his equipment runs across, through or upon any public street or on any land other than his own and that of his neighbors.

It further appears that applicant does not desire to extend his system to any new consumers, and that the Centerville Water Company is ready and willing to serve any

other consumers in applicant's vicinity.

Under all the conditions of this case, we are of the opinion that the application should be granted.

O R D E R.

PETER MATHIESON having applied to this Commission for a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the furnishing by him of water to certain consumers in the town of Centerville, Alameda County, to whom he has been serving water for some time, and a public hearing having been held thereon,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the continuance of service of water by applicant to his present consumers.
