PENINSULAR RAILWAY COMPANY having applied to the Commission for authority to sell to Charles D. Blaney, in accordance with the terms and conditions of a form of deed attached to the application in this proceeding and marked "Exhibit A", the following described real property lying and being in the County of Santa Clara, State of California:

Beginning in the southerly line of the Santa Clara and Saratoga Road at a point S. 78° 31' W. 477.2 feet from the northeast corner of lands of Mark Cornish; thence southerly on a curved line of 140 feet radius, parallel to and 10 feet distant from the center line of the track of the San Jose, Los Gatos Interurban Railway Company to a point on the eastern line of the Saratoga and Los Gatos Road; thence along the easterly line of said Road, N. 45° 58' W. 18.0 feet and N. 44° 02' W. 170 feet to the intersection of the southerly line of the Santa Clara and Saratoga Road and the easterly line of the Saratoga and Los Gatos Road; thence along the southerly line of said Santa Clara and Saratoga Road N. 55° 15' E. 110.4 feet and N. 78° 31' E. 45.0 feet to the place of beginning; containing 0.224 acres, and being the same property conveyed by Mark Cornish and Ygnacia G. de Cornish, his wife, to said San Jose, Los Gatos Interurban Railway Company, a corporation, by deed dated December 5th, 1903, and recorded December 19th, 1903, in Book 29 of Deeds, at page 327, Records of said Santa Clara County.

TOGETHER with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents, issues and profits thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD all and singular the said premises, together with the appurtenances, unto the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever.

And it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary, and that the application should be granted,--

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application in this proceeding be, and the same is hereby, granted.
