Decision No. 37 1/2 :

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION
OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

IN THE MATTER OF THE REGULATION OF RATES
FOR THE CARRYING OF FREIGHT BETWEEN THE
STATIONS WITHIN THE BUSINESS DISTRICT OF
THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES AND LOS ANGELES
HARBOR BY THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY AND
THE SAN PEDRO, LOS ANGELES AND SALT LAKE
RAILROAD COMPANY.

O R D E R

In the decision heretofore rendered in this case, the reasonableness of the rates on the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad between the points involved was not determined because of the fact that the Commission did not have presented to it any testimony touching the value of its property involved on behalf of the defendant San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad except such as occurs in the testimony of Mr. J. B. Pope, a witness called in behalf of the Southern Pacific Company, (transcript 658), which testimony, as far as the property of the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad is concerned, the Commission considered too vague, indefinite and general to be of any value. Under these circumstances, the Commission did not desire to decide the case wholly upon the testimony presented by the complainants unless the defendant San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad should have a farther opportunity to present such further facts to the Commission, touching such valuation, as it should desire.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the defendant San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad Company appear before this Commission at 10:30 o'clock A.M. on the 23d day of January, 1912, at the Supreme Court Rooms in the Bullard Block in the City of

Los Angeles, at which time and place it may present any testimony which it desires touching the value of that portion of its lines involved in this case, together with the value of its equipment used thereon, and any other relevant facts touching the issues in this case.

Complainants and the defendant Southern Pacific Company may appear at the same time and place for the purpose of testing, by cross-examination or otherwise, the testimony offered by the San Pedro, Los Angeles and Salt Lake Railroad under the permission of this order.
