private corporation organized, acting,

authorizing the sale by said applicants
to the City of Santa Cruz, a municipal
corporation, in the State of California,
of property described in the annexed
agreement, of the water system and public
utility known as the "Hihn Water System."

BY THE COMMISSION:

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

The Railroad Commission having, on October
4, 1916, authorized the transfer to the City of Santa
Cruz of certain public utility water property describ-
ed in said order, one of the conditions of said order
being as follows:

"Inasmuch as a portion of the water system
to be transferred is situated outside, and is
supplying water to consumers outside of the City
of Santa Cruz, the authority herein granted to
transfer this system shall not become effective
until the City of Santa Cruz shall have filed
with the Commission a stipulation declaring that
the City takes this system subject to all the

existing rights and obligations attached to the system as a public utility supplying water outside the municipal limits, and shall have received from the Railroad Commission a supplemental order, stating that such a stipulation satisfactory in form to the Commission has been filed."

And the City of Santa Cruz having, on October 11, 1916, filed a stipulation in accordance with said condition,--

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the form of said stipulation be, and the same is hereby, approved, and that said stipulation be filed.
