SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

This Commission having on October 16, 1916, made an order in this proceeding authorizing Coley-Craig Company to sell its telephone system and franchises to The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company upon certain conditions, one of which was that:

> "The Pscific Telephone and Telegraph Company shall file with the Railroad Commission a stipulation duly anthorized by its Board of Directors agreeing for itself, its successors and assigns, that it will never claim in any proceeding before the Railroad Commission, any court, or any other public authority any value for any franchise or franchises which are to be conveyed to it by Coley-Craig Company in excess of the moneys which were originally paid by Coley-Craig Company for said franchise or franchises to the public authority granting same, which moneys shall be stated for each franchise in said stipulation."

and The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company having on November 3, 1916, by resolution, authorized the filing of a
