SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY having,  
on January 17, 1917, filed with this Commission a stipulation  
in accordance with the order heretofore made in this proceed-  
in on December 29, 1916, which stipulation provides that said  
Company, its successors and assigns, shall never claim before  
the Railroad Commission, or any other public authority, any  
value for the rights and privileges conferred by Ordinance  
No. 401 of the City of Richmond in excess of the amount paid  
therefor at the time said ordinance was adopted, which amount  
is stated to be not in excess of \$822.84.--

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said stipulation be, and  
the same is hereby approved and ordered filed.
