SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY  
having filed with this Commission a stipulation in ac-  
cordance with the order heretofore made in this pro-  
ceeding on January 24th, 1917 (Decision No. 4015) which  
stipulation provides that said Company, its successors  
and assigns will never claim before the Railroad Com-  
mission, or any other public authority, any value for  
the rights and privileges conferred by Ordinance No.  
161 of the City of Salinas in excess of the sum of  
\$344.15, the amount stated by applicant to have been  
paid therefor at the time said ordinance was adopted;  
and it appearing to this Commission that said stipula-  
tion is in form satisfactory to this Commission so far  
as may be necessary for the purposes of this proceeding.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said stipulation

be and the same is hereby approved and ordered filed.
