SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

THE PACIFIC TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY
having, on February 28th, 1917, filed with this Commission
a stipulation in accordance with the order heretofore made
in this proceeding on February 1st, 1917 (Decision No.
4077) which stipulation provides that said Company, its
successors and assigns, will never claim before the
Railroad Commission, or any other public authority, any
value for the rights and privileges conferred by a cer-
tain ordinance of the City of Dinuba entitled "An Ordinance
granting a franchise to the Pacific Telephone and
Telegraph Company (passed by the Board of Trustees of the
City of Dinuba on June 23rd, 1915)" in excess of the sum
of \$112.50, the amount stated by applicant to have been
paid therefor at the time said ordinance was adopted;
and it appearing to this Commission that said stipulation
is in form satisfactory to this Commission so far as may

be necessary for the purposes of this proceeding.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said stipulation be
and the same is hereby approved and ordered filed.
