ORDER.

San Francisco-Oakland Terminal Railways having applied
to this Commission for a certificate that public convenience and
necessity require the exercise of the rights and privileges granted
to applicant by the City of Richmond, in its Resolution No. 418,
passed on November 25, 1912, by which resolution applicant is given
permission, upon certain conditions, to lay down and use for a street
railroad a single track switch, with its necessary poles and wires,
over, along and upon certain portions of Standard Avenue and a private
right of way in the City of Richmond, and it appearing that the rights
granted to applicant in this resolution are to be exercised in terri-
tory already served by applicant, and the Commission being of the opin-
ion that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that public convenience and neces-
sity require the exercise by San Francisco-Oakland Terminal Railways
of the rights and privileges granted to said company by the City of
Richmond, in its Resolution No. 418, passed on November 25, 1912.
