DECISION

Eshleman, Commissioner.

In this case complainant alleges an overcharge of \$17.55 on a shipment of live stock from Sisson to Pinole. By stipulation the matter is submitted on the testimony presented in Case No. 230. We find the complainant's allegation to be correct and that the amount of \$17.55, on the authority of said case, should be recovered by complainant.

The defendant is accordingly ordered and directed to pay to complainant the sum of \$17.55, being the difference between the charges paid by the complainant and those which it would have paid if the proper rate had been applied, together with interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum from the date hereof until paid.

The principle upon which this decision is based shall be extended to like shipments and a similar order will be made by the Commission upon the presentation of proof of such like shipments, refunds thereon to be made by the carrier after receiving authorization of the Commission therefor.

The foregoing decision is hereby approved and ordered filed as the decision of the Commission.
