REPORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the matter of the application of SOUTHMEN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the construction of a spur track at grade across second and East Streets, in the Town of hollister, County of San Benito, State of California.

Application No.3398.

By the Commission.

December 21. 1917. filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct a spur track at grade across second and mast streets, in the Town of Hollister, County of San Benito, California, as hereinafter indicated; and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary; that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hollister has granted the necessary permission for the construction of said crossings at grade; and it further appearing that it is not reasonable nor practicable to avoid grade crossings with said streets, and that this application should be granted subject to the conditions hereinafter specified:

IT IS MERKEY ORDERED, That permission be hereby granted Southern Facilic Company to construct a spur track at grade across Second and East Streets, in the Town or Hollister, County of San Benito, California, described as follows:

beginning at a point in the northerly line of second street forty-two feet westerly from the westerly line of most street; thence southeasterly across second and most Streets to a point in the

easterly line of kast Street sixty-six feet southerly from the southerly line of Second Street.

All of the above as shown by the map attached to the application; said crossings to be constructed subject to the following conditions, viz-=

- (1) The entire expense of constructing the crossingo, together with the cost of their maintenance thereafter in good and first-class condition for the safe and convenient use of the public, shall be borne by applicant.
- (Z) Said crossings shall be constructed of a width and type to conform to that portion of the streets to be crossed now graded, with grades of approach not exceeding four (4) per cent; shall be protected by switable crossing signs, and shall in every way be made said for the passage thereover of vehicles and other road traific.
- (3) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operstion, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if. in its judgment, the public convenience and necessity demand such action.
