O R D E R

Daniel Corcoran having applied for a certificate that public convenience and necessity require him to operate a passenger stage service between Groveland and Chinese Station through intermediate points, all in Tuolumne County; and the Commission being advised in the matter in connection with Decision No. 4960 of December 13, 1917, authorizing C. M. Copping to operate a similar service between said points and also between Chinese Station and Sonora, which service when established will adequately serve the public, and the Commission finding that public convenience and necessity do not require service by applicant, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be denied.

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that public convenience and necessity do not require the operation by Daniel Corcoran of automobile stage service between Groveland and Chinese Station, Tuolumne County.
