ORDER

Leslie T. Alward and C. F. Brouillard, partners in business, have petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by them of an automobile stage and truck line as a common carrier of freight, passengers and parcels between Delta and Carrville and intermediate points.

Applicants propose to establish a service of one round trip daily, and to serve the communities at Delta, Toll House, Trinity Center and Carrville, and to charge rates for the transportation of passengers in accordance with a schedule filed with the application in this proceeding. A rate of \$1.50 per hundred pounds, with minimum charge of twenty-five cents on any shipment, is to be charged for freight between all points.

Applicants have not yet secured the equipment with which they propose to operate this line, but propose to secure satisfactory equipment for the proposed service.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by Leslie T. Alward and C. F. Brouillard, partners in business, of an automobile stage and truck line as a common carrier of freight, passengers and parcels between Delta and Carrville and intermediate points; provided, that this declaration shall not become effective until said Alward and Brouillard shall have received a supplemental order herein reciting that certified copies of permits from the Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Shasta and Trinity have been issued in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917, and filed with this Commission; and provided, further, that the rights and privileges herein granted shall not be assigned or transferred unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such assignment or transfer has first been procured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicants herein or is leased by such applicants under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
