SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

It appearing that in the order in Decision No. 5227,
made on March 25, 1918, in the above entitled proceedings the

rate for pumping water for the irrigation of lands above the level of the ditches was inadvertently omitted from the rate schedule, and that it is fair and reasonable that a rate be established for this service,

IT IS HEREBY FOUND AS A FACT that the rates set out in this Supplemental Order are fair, just and reasonable charges for pumping water for the irrigation of lands above the level that can be served from the canals of this company by gravity; and,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Sutter Butte Canal Company establish and file with the Railroad Commission on or before twenty (20) days from the date of this Supplemental Order the following rates, in addition to the rates set out in Decision No. 5227, made on March 25, 1918, in the above entitled proceedings, for pumping water to lands above the level that can be served from Sutter Butte Canal Company's canals and ditches by gravity:

Flat Rates

For rice irrigation \$1.00 per acre per year
For all other uses50 " " " "

Measured Rate

For each one foot pumped. \$.20
