FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

The Railroad Commission HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require and will require the exercise by The Southern Sierras Power Company of the rights and privileges under Ordinance Number 41 adopted the 14th day of April, 1914, by the Board of Trustees of the City of Rialto in the County of San Bernardino, State of California.

The Railroad Commission FURTHER DECLARES that The Southern Sierras Power Company has filed a stipulation as provided in the order heretofore made in this proceeding on March 27, 1918, which stipulation states that neither said company, its successors or assigns will ever claim before the Railroad Commission, or any other public body, a value for the rights and privileges granted in Ordinance Number 41 of the City of Rialto, a copy of which ordinance is attached to the stipulation, in excess of the amount actually paid to the City of Rialto as a consideration for the granting of such rights and privileges, which amount is stated to be \$150.00.

The Railroad Commission HEREBY APPROVES the proposed bookkeeping entries filed by applicants in the above entitled matter on April 30, 1918, provided that said approval shall not be interpreted as a finding of value of any of the items of property referred to therein.
