WHEREAS Southern California Edison Company has
filed with this Commission its Application No. 3728 to
withdraw its existing domestic and commercial lighting
schedule applicable in the City of San Bernardino and to
make effective in place thereof the revised schedule as
set forth in this order, which will result in a reduction
in rates to residence and large commercial lighting con-
sumers, and good cause appearing that the same should be
authorized,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that California Edison
Company be and the same is hereby authorized to file
and make effective for domestic and commercial lighting
service in the City of San Bernardino the following

schedule:

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Southern California Edison Company be and the same is hereby authorized:

(1) To withdraw Schedules "L-M" and "L-T", being the schedules for lighting service of Pacific Light and Power Corporation for the City of San Bernardino as set forth in the schedules on file with the Commission.

(2) To continue as deviations such consumers whose rates would be increased by the revised standard schedule above listed, until such time as such consumers discontinue service, or until ordered otherwise by this Commission.
