O R D E R

C. M. Ray has petitioned the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight and express packages between Sacramento and Woodland and intermediate points.

Applicant has acquired the equipment of the Sacramento Auto Truck Company which has heretofore covered the route herein applied for, and desires that the operation of the service be placed on an authorized basis.

Applicant proposes to operate a schedule of one round trip daily, except Sundays and holidays, between Sacramento and Woodland, and to serve the City of Davis as an intermediate point.

The rates proposed by applicant are in accordance with a schedule marked Exhibit "A" and filed with the application in this proceeding.

Permits as required by the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917, have been granted by the Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Yolo and Sacramento, the Board

of Trustees of the City of Davis and the Board of Commissioners of the City of Sacramento, and certified copies of said permits have been filed with the Railroad Commission with the application herein.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by C. M. Ray of an automobile truck line as a common carrier of freight and express packages between Sacramento and Woodland; provided, that the rights and privileges herein granted shall not be assigned or transferred unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such assignment or transfer has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
