for leave to continue to charge the toll rates in effect on the 10th day of October, 1911, until the further order of the Commission.

ORDER.

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company having filed its application for permission, pending the further order of this Commission, to continue to charge the rates and tolls shown in the published schedules of long distance tariffs in effect on the 10th day of October, 1911, except where the same have been subsequently reduced, notwithstanding the provisions of Section 24 (b) of the Public Utilities Act referring to the rates and tolls for long and short distance telephone service.

It is hereby ordered, that said applicant be permitted to continue such charges notwithstanding said provisions of said Section, for a period of thirty days from the date of service of this order, within which period said applicant is directed to file with this Commission schedules of rates complying with the provisions of said Section with reference to long and short distance telephone service, or, in case said applicant desires in any case to justify its charge of a greater compensation in the aggregate for the transmission of a long distance message or conversation for a shorter than for a longer distance in the cases specified

in sub-section (b) of said Section 24, said applicant shall file within said time an application or applications for permission to continue such charges as provided in said sub-section of said Section, whereupon a date will be set for hearing the same.
