



Vacaville, operated upon the schedule herein proposed, the demand of that community for quick and direct accommodations between Sacramento and Vacaville will be afforded.

No one appeared in protest at the hearing on this application, and the applicant herein testified that the auto stage operators between Sacramento and Davis and Sacramento and Winters had all stated that they had no objection to the establishment of the proposed service.

As a further indication that public convenience and necessity require this operation, applicant has secured permits from the City Commission of the City of Sacramento, the Boards of Supervisors of Yolo and Solano Counties, the Boards of Trustees of the Towns of Davis, Dixon and Vacaville, in accordance with Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917, as evidenced by certified copies thereof filed with the application in this proceeding.

#### ORDER

JOHN W. WALKER having applied to the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of an automobile stage service between the City of Sacramento and the town of Vacaville and intermediate points as a common carrier of passengers.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by John W. Walker of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers between the City of Sacramento and the town of Vacaville and intermediate points.

Provided that the rights and privileges herein granted shall not be assigned or transferred unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such assignment or transfer has first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle may be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
