FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Santa Barbara Telephone Company having, on August 7, 1918, filed with this Commission a stipulation in accordance with the order heretofore made in this proceeding on the twenty-sixth day of July, 1918, which stipulation provides that said company, its successors and assigns shall never claim before the Railroad Commission or any other public authority any value for the rights and privileges conferred by said Ordinance No. 965 of the City of Santa Barbara,
