Decision No. 5694.

O R D E R

Adolph M. Stroehl, operating under the fictitious name of San Diego-Campo U. S. Mail Stage, has applied to the Railroad Commission for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require the operation by him of a passenger and express service as a common carrier between San Diego and Campo and intermediate points.

Applicant has secured the United States Mail contract formerly held by E. E. Zettering between San Diego and Campo, and desires the right to convey passengers and express matter as a common carrier in connection with the operation of the mail route.

Applicant proposes to charge rates in accordance with a schedule filed as Exhibit "A" with the application in this proceeding, and to operate on a schedule of one round trip, daily except Sundays, serving the intermediate communities at Spring Valley, Jamul, Dulzara, Barrett and Potrero, all of which are located on the County Highway.

The equipment proposed to be used consists of one Hudson Touring car, with capacity of six passengers.

We are of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity require the operation by Adolph M. Stroehl, operating under the fictitious name of San Diego-Campo U. S. Mail Stage, of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers and express packages between San Diego and Campo and intermediate points; provided that this declaration shall not become effective until said Adolph M. Stroehl shall have secured from the Railroad Commission a supplemental order herein reciting that said Adolph M. Stroehl has filed herein certified copies of permits issued by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego and from the Council of the City of San Diego in accordance with the provisions of Section 3 of Chapter 213, Laws of 1917; and provided, further, that the rights and privileges herein granted may not be assigned or transferred unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such assignment or transfer shall have first been secured.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that no vehicle shall be operated under this certificate unless such vehicle is owned by the applicant herein or is leased by such applicant under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
