BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of an application of  
the PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

the construction of a state highway  
grade crossing over the main line tracks  
of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad  
about three-quarters (¾) of a mile north  
of Ignacio, in Marin County, State of  
California.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA on relation of the Department of Engineering, having on July 12, 1916, filed with the Commission an application for permission to construct a state highway at grade across the tracks of the Northwestern Pacific Railroad at a point about three-quarters (¾) of a mile north of Ignacio; and the Commission having granted this permission in Decision No. 3537, which stipulated among other conditions that an automatic flagman be installed and the expense of its installation be borne by the applicant; and it now appearing that applicant has constructed said state highway; that its use is necessary to avoid a detour of six miles by way of Novato and that the funds for the installation of an automatic flagman are not available at the present time and that the view at the crossing is unobstructed;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That paragraph five (5) of the Commission's order in Decision No. 3537 be and the same hereby is

amended as follows:

(5) For the protection of said crossing there shall be installed an automatic flagman of a type approved by the Commission and the expense of its installation shall be borne by applicant; said automatic flagman shall be installed within sixty (60) days after the applicant is notified by the Commission to install the same.

The foregoing supplemental order is hereby approved and ordered filed as the first supplemental order of the Railroad Commission of the State of California.
